Lois G. Taylor, 86, died peacefully Tuesday, December 26th at her house in Pierson, Florida surrounded by family and friends. Mrs. Taylor was born on January 29th, 1931 to the late Oscar F. Greenlund and Bernice C. Greenlund in Pierson. She was a lifelong resident of Pierson. Mrs. Taylor was a 1959 graduate of Stetson University where she majored in education. She worked and taught at Pierson Elementary School for 39 years until her retirement in 1996. She was also a recipient of the Teacher of the Year award. She was predeceased by her husband James D. Taylor in 1998 a son James T. Taylor in 2013 and her brother Freeman Greenlund in 2010. Mrs. Taylor was a lifelong member of Ebenezer Lutheran Church in Pierson, where she served as Council President, taught Sunday school and confirmation classes, and sang in the choir. Mrs. Taylor was also a longtime active member of Epsilon Sigma Alpha, Epsilon Gamma chapter, an international service sorority, which is involved in numerous service oriented projects benefitting organizations such as St. Judes Children Hospital in Memphis, Tennessee and the Florida School for the Deaf and Blind in St. Augustine. Mrs. Taylor very much enjoyed working on these projects through her sorority. Mrs. Taylor is survived by a son, Timothy of Astor, her daughter Tina (Mark) Klaers of Deltona, grandchildren Tiffany (Jamie) Billings and James (Brittany) Taylor of Ormond Beach, Katherine Taylor of Ocala and Jacob Klaers of Deltona, and 5 great-grandchildren. She will be greatly missed by her family, numerous friends and hundreds of former students that she taught through the years. A visitation will be held Thursday, December 28th from 6-8pm at Allen-Summerhill Funeral Home in DeLand. Funeral Services will be held on Friday, December 29th at Ebenezer Lutheran Church in Pierson at 11am with graveside services to follow at Ebenezer Lutheran Cemetery in Pierson.
